How Can I Help With Camp?

Great question! There are several different ways you can help us prepare for Camp 1:27 this summer. Here are a few:

- 1. Sponsor a camper. Camp is free for our campers but it is not free for us. We depend on faithful supporters to sponsor a child so we can continue to offer Camp 1:27 free of charge. Sponsoring a camper is \$100. This amount covers their food, lodging, and activities for the week they attend. This would be a great way to involve your family, friends, small groups, churches, or businesses.
- 2. Serve at a Work Day. We will plan a few Work Days to knock out some projects before we host our campers and staff. These work days will include cleaning facilities, yard work, and whatever new projects we decide are needed. Work Day dates will be published via email, website and social media. Our first Work Day of the year is coming up April 3rd!
- 3. Refer Staff Members. We are actively recruiting for staff members. We need to hire 16 counselors and 20 junior counselors this summer. If you know godly teenagers and/or college students who love children, please refer them to us! This is a tremendous opportunity for young people to do intense ministry as they serve our campers. Please let your churches, youth groups, college ministries, and small group leaders know. (We would also be happy to speak to these groups if there is interest!)
- 4. Tell Your Foster Parent Friends/Family. Not only is Camp 1:27 a blast for campers, it offers a week of rest for foster parents. This is a Win-Win! Please let your foster parent friends know about Camp 1:27 if they do not already. We would love to serve them by giving their foster children one of the best weeks of their life.
